Subject: Centrally Sponsored Scheme for development of infrastructure facilities for the judiciary – Release of Central Assistance to the Government of Meghalaya for the year 2022-23.

Sir,

I am directed to convey the sanction of the President of India for the payment of Rs. 3,82,75,000/- (Rupees Three Crore Eighty Two Lakh Seventy Five Thousand only) during 2022-23 as central assistance to the State Government of Meghalaya, as first installment, under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme for development of Infrastructure facilities for judiciary, for construction of court buildings and residential accommodation for judges /judicial officers covering District and Subordinate Courts. The High Courts are not covered under the revised Scheme.

- 2. The expenditure involved is debitable to Demand No. 65 during 2022-23 under Major Head 3601 Grants-in-aid to State Governments, Sub Major Head 06 Centrally Sponsored Schemes, Minor Head 06.101 Central Assistance/Share, Sub Head 57 Infrastructural facilities for Judiciary, Detailed Head 03 –Infrastructural facilities for Judiciary, Object Head 57.03.35 Grants for Creation of Capital Assets.
- 3. The State Government is requested to utilize this amount along-with the State Government's Share on the pattern of 90:10 sharing basis between Central and State Governments. Funds are released for ongoing and new Projects complying with the norms and specification for the construction of court halls, lawyers halls, toilet complexes, digital computer room and residential quarters of subordinate judiciary, as per the extant Guidelines of the Scheme. The State Government may furnish the Project-wise details for the projects against which above funds are allocated/utilised. The details of amount spent by the State Government along-with audit certificate, utilization certificate in the prescribed format (GFR-19A) duly signed by the competent authority and physical achievements may please be sent to this Department at the earliest.
- 4. The State Government is to ensure the following conditions:
  - i. The entire amount of central share of CSS released to the State is transferred to the Single Nodal Account of the SNA concerned.
  - ii. Corresponding State share in full is credited to by the State Government to the Single Nodal Account of the SNA.
- iii. Interest accrued in the SNA account has been deposited in the CFI.
- iv. All the bank accounts except the Single Nodal Account of the SNA and all the bank accounts of IAs except zero balance account opened under Department of Expenditure's instructions dated 23/03/2021 have been closed and the amount available in these accounts has been deposited in the Single Nodal Account of the SNA concerned.

- v. Separate budget lines for Central and State share under the CSS in their detailed demand for grants of the State has been opened.
- vi. All other provisions of the DoE's instructions dated 23/03/2021 regarding release of funds for CSS have been strictly complied with.
- 5. The accounts of the State Government in respect of the Grants being released shall be open to inspection by the Sanctioning authority and audit, both by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India under the provision of CAG (DPC) Act, 1971 and internal audit by the Principal Account Office of the Department of Justice, whenever the State Government is called upon to do so.
- 6. This sanction has been entered in the Register of Grants at Serial No. 06 at page no. 01-02.
- 7. This issues with the concurrence of Joint Secretary & Financial Advisor (Law) *vide* Note No. 203 dated 07.06.2022 (efile no 498) and approval of Secretary (Justice) *vide* Note No. 209 dated 09.06.2022.
